Narrated by actors, Tom Hanks and Keith David, this fascinating piece of American History gets five stars from its reviewers on Amazon.

Filmmaker, Irena Salina, focuses a much needed light on the threats to our most necessary resource, water. The film reveals how massive dams, pollution, inadequate planning and regulation have affected the water supplies all over the world. 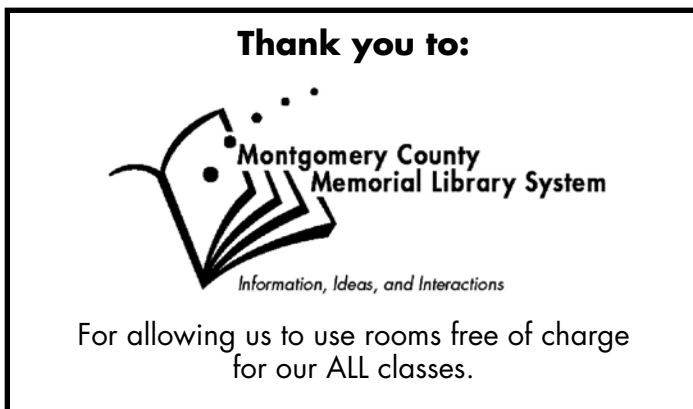

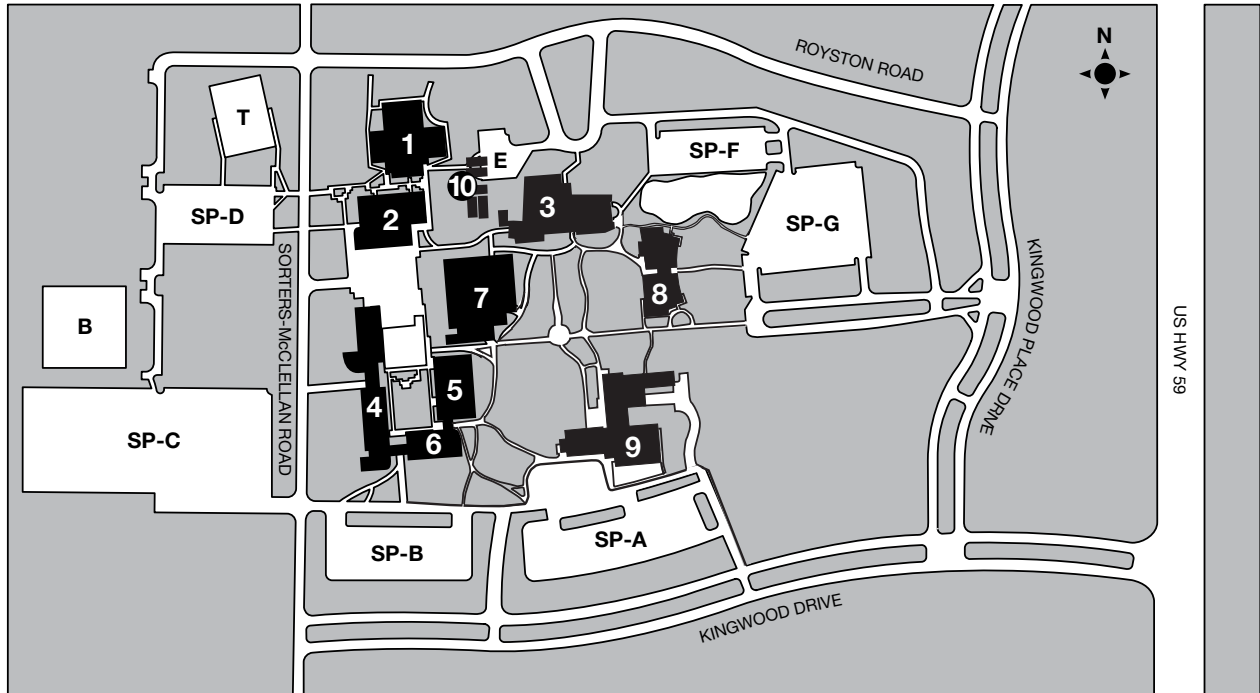

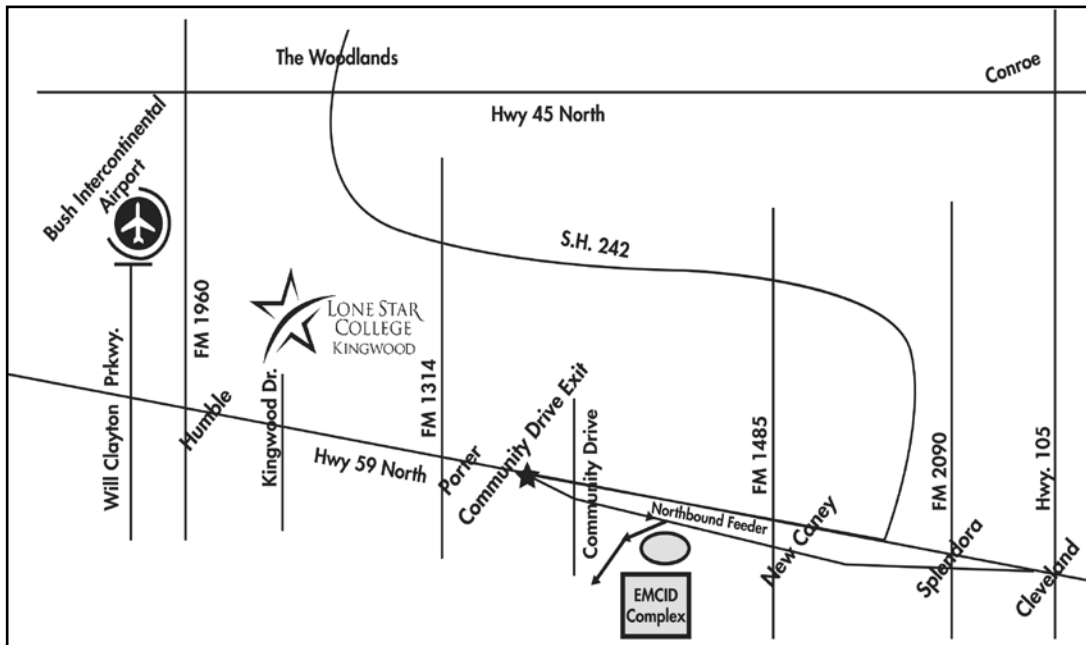

Unless otherwise noted, all classes are held at the Lone Star College-Kingwood (LSC-Kingwood) off-site center at the East Montgomery County Improvement District (EMCID) Complex at 21575 Highway 59N, New Caney, Texas 77357. Directions: From Highway 59N, take the Community Drive feeder exit, but stay on the feeder (DO NOT TURN RIGHT ONTO COMMUNITY DRIVE) and drive 1.6 miles. Pass over White Oak Creek, by Rosewood Funeral Home, and under the Community Drive overpass. Turn right onto the EMCID Complex site—there will be a pond with fountains in front of the building. There are two, two-story red brick buildings with green roofs at the site. The north (left) building is the R.B. Tullis Library; the south (right) building is the EMCID Building. Classes are in the south wing of the EMCID Building. Lone Star College-Kingwood signage is not posted until entering the parking lot.
