

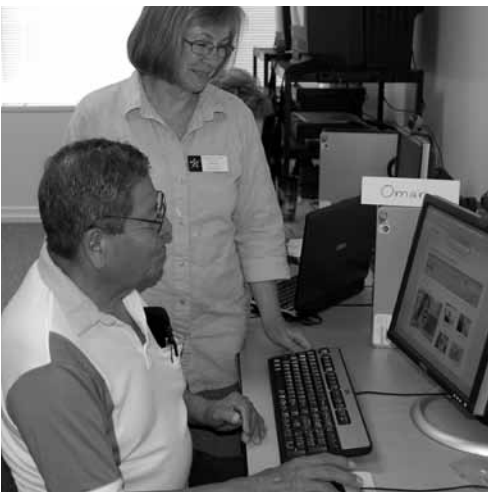

Readers' Theatre

Approximately 12-15 enrollees present an audience-pleaser short play. Several comedies are under consideration pending enrollee profile (m/f) and publisher approval. The play will be cast, blocked and rehearsed about 7 times and performed as a 'staged reading' once in the rehearsal site and perhaps a second time in another venue. It will be presented with actors carrying scripts, wearing available character-like attire, using simple props, scant scenery and minimal sound/lighting effects.

COMPUTERS & TECHNOLOGY

Computer Boot Camp

In one month we will have you in basic shape with a working knowledge of computers. Each class is taught by an instructor and coach, and will build on the previous class experience. Studies show repetition and practical application will help students become comfortable in a technical world. Classes are small in order to provide more personal attention. Practice time is available each week under the guidance of a coach. Fee includes a jump drive to save your work. Six classes over three weeks. Fee \$46

Week One: ABCs of Computers - Basic skills. This training is for students who have limited knowledge of computers. It will prepare students to work effectively within the Windows environment and will place an emphasis on developing basic skills with the keyboard and mouse while explaining computer hardware and software. You will learn how to access and navigate the internet.

Week Two: PC101 - Basic Word Processing and File Management This course will use Microsoft WORD 2010 to teach the basic skills needed for word processing. You will learn basic computer file management techniques so that you will be able to store and find things on your computer. You will learn to save items to a jump drive so you can take your work "on the road".

Week Three: PC102 - Basic Spreadsheets, Internet, and E-mail This course will use Microsoft EXCEL 2010 to teach the basic skills needed to develop spreadsheets and useful ways to use them for everything from home budgets to keeping track of your address book or book library.

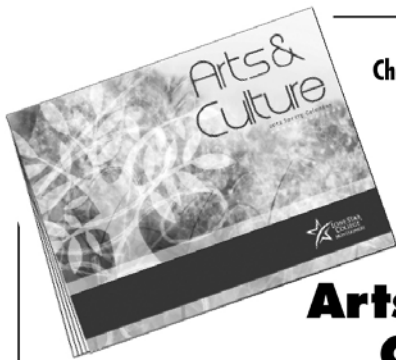

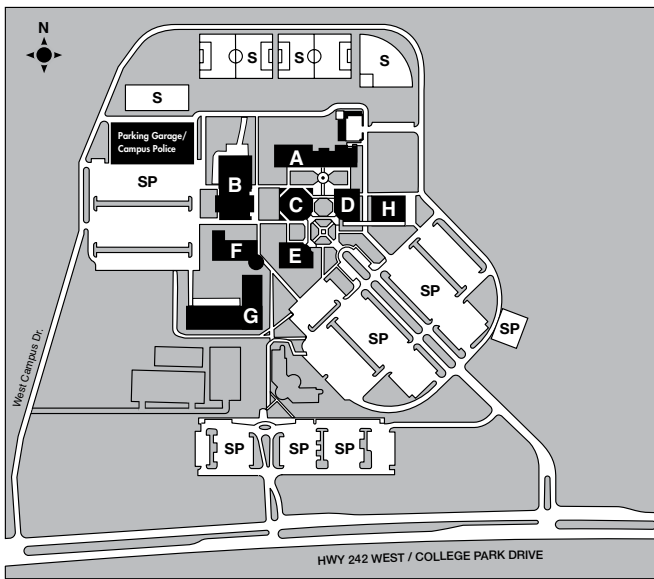
