

Ethnicity Report - A 6-Year Trend Comparison - Fall 2009

Hispanics are the fastest growing population at LSCS--increasing by 8% in student representation over the last five years system-wide-- from 17% of our students in Fall 03 to 25% Fall 09.

At LSC-North Harris, Hispanics are the majority population at 34% -- **this is our fastest growing Hispanic population: a 9% increase in Hispanic student population in five years.** At all other LSC colleges, Hispanics are second behind white students and are followed by black and Asian students in overall representation of the students served.

The increase in white students is the smallest growth of all the ethnicities system-wide at only 15% of the Fall 03 number. There are 3,482 more white students than there were in Fall 03. This is 15% more than the Fall 03 number. There are 56% more black students in Fall 09 than there were in Fall 03.

Hispanic students have more than doubled their number in the six years since Fall 03--there are 8,081 **MORE** Hispanic students at LSCS than there were in Fall 03. This is 120% of the Fall 03 number. This is a higher increase than our overall student count for the system which rose by 52% of its Fall 03 number.

Although still a minority of LSCS students, Asians have increased by 90% of their Fall 03 count, increasing in number by 1,888 above the 2,107 of Fall 03.

System-wide LSCS increased its students served count by 20,145 students over the last six years. This is 52% above the Fall 03 count of 38,699.

Cy Fair had the largest increase in white students over the last six years: increasing by 2,087 students or 56% more than the Fall 03 #.

Cy Fair also has the largest increase in the number of black students: 1,073 more than in Fall 03. Although Cy Fair was expected to grow because of its young age, the black student growth outpaced the college as a whole by increasing 176% of their Fall 03 number.

Hispanic students at Cy Fair also grew at a rate higher than the college average: Cy Fair has 202% more Hispanics than it had in Fall 03.

Although still a minority, Cy Fair's Asians students increased by 125% over its Fall 03 count: up 823 students. This accounts for 43% (823 of the 1,888) of the Asian student increase system-wide.

Kingwood's white student count only increased by 13% over its Fall 03 count staying consistent with our system increase of 13%.

Kingwood's black student population increased by 623 students more than Fall 03 which represents a 137% increase. Kingwood is third behind Cy Fair and Montgomery for their increase of black students.

Hispanic students at Kingwood increased by 947 students over Fall 03--this is a 118% increase. Again, mirroring the system growth in Hispanic students.

Kingwood diverges a bit from the system growth pattern by increasing its Asian population by 108% of the Fall 03 number. System-wide Asian increase from Fall 03 was 90%.

Montgomery is second behind Cy Fair for growth of the white student population. White students increased by 32% of its Fall 03 count.

The black student population at Montgomery increased nearly 150% over its Fall 03 numbers. Again only second to Cy Fair in the black student growth.

Montgomery had a growth of its Hispanic student population of 157% of its Fall 03 numbers. Second to Cy Fair's 202% growth.

Montgomery stands out as the highest increase in Asian students since Fall 03. An increase of 286 students means that since Fall 03, Montgomery's Asian student population has increased 217% of Fall 03's 132 Asian students.

North Harris had the greatest decrease in white students since Fall 03: 22% LESS than Fall 03's 4,216. In Fall 09 there are 3,293 white students at North Harris.

Black students at North Harris increased 37% over their Fall 03 number of 2,360. There are 871 more black students at NH In Fall 09 than there were in Fall 03.

Hispanics grew by 70% of their Fall 03 numbers at NH. As with Cy Fair and Montgomery's newness factor, North Harris's age and space limitations have made its growth not as marked as the younger colleges.

North Harris shows the least amount of growth in the Asian student population. There are 190 more Asian student at NH than there were in Fall 03--this is a 24% increase.

Despite its maturation and physical constraints, North Harris managed to grow by 23% of its Fall 03 student count, rising by 2,532 students.

Tomball's white student population is unique in that it is the only college to remain virtually unchanged since Fall 03.

Tomball's black student population increased 82% over its Fall 03 count.

Tomball's Hispanic population increased by 102%--putting its growth in Hispanics in 4th out of the 5 colleges.

Asian students increased their representation by 391 students over the Fall 03 numbers making it a 111% increase. Tomball is 3rd in its Asian student increase after Montgomery and Cy Fair.

Cy Fair increased its total student count by 29% above what it had in Fall 03. Its growth puts it 4th behind: Cy Fair: 120%*, Montgomery:59%, Kingwood: 48% and just ahead of North Harris' 29%.
