Did you know?

Lone Star has increased its Fall Course Success Rates two years in a row!

Fall 2014 = 67.9%

Fall 2015 = 69.7% **+ 2.6%**

Fall 2016 = 70.5%

Importantly, rates for Hispanic, Black and White students have all increased.

★ Under the leadership of Executive Vice Chancellor, Dr. Alicia Harvey-Smith, Lone Star College is developing a comprehensive Strategic Enrollment Management Plan. Spotlighting Promising Practices

This month we would like to recognize **LSC-Tomball** for implementing research-based initiatives to promote student success.

★ Under the leadership of LSC-Tomball president, Dr. Lee Ann Nutt, and an advisory committee comprised of faculty and staff, LSC-Tomball is implementing a research-based initiative – the Global GRIT Initiative (GGI). GRIT is defined by Dr. Paul G. Stoltz as a person's "capacity to dig deep and do whatever it takes—even sacrifice, struggle and suffer—to achieve his/her most worthy goals in the best ways." GRIT is also an acronym for Growth, Resilience, Instinct and Tenacity. However, more than the quantity of GRIT someone has, the quality of their GRIT matters too. Good, strong and smart GRIT is the optimal combination. According to 30-years of research by Dr. Stoltz, GRIT is predictive of positive life outcomes such as employment status and ability to move up in life.

Believing that GRIT could also positively impact college key performance indicators such as persistence, degree completion and retention, LSC-Tomball launched its GRIT initiative in the Spring 2015 semester and has continued to infuse GRIT into its culture, embedding it into the classroom and the curriculum, into extra-curricular activities and in student support programs. From an assessment standpoint, LSC-Tomball has been tracking the project's outcomes. Based on an experiment in the Fall 2015 semester that included random assignment of faculty, classes in the experimental group (With GRIT) had a 3% higher course completion rate than the control group (No New GRIT). Another significant finding was that students' GRIT Gauge™ scores improved an average of 22 points on a post-test at the end of the semester, compared to pre-test scores at the beginning of the semester. LSC-Tomball continues to provide the GRIT Gauge™ to each student twice each semester. As such, GRIT data has been collected from more than 3,000 students. The goal is to upload GRIT Gauge™ data into iStar this summer so additional analysis can be completed. Ultimately LSC-Tomball hopes this data will be incorporated into Civitas Illume as a predictive variable for student persistence.

LSC-Tomball is a leader among community colleges nationally on this effort, and their second annual GRIT Summit is scheduled for October 13, 2017. In early fall, LSC-Tomball's GRIT story will be the topic of the public television show "Informed with Rob Lowe." Filming at the college will occur early Fall 2017.
