

Applied Arts & Sciences

The Bachelor of Applied Arts and Sciences degree is designed to enable Associate of Applied Science graduates of post-secondary career and technology education and vocational-technical programs to obtain baccalaureate degrees. Under this program, the 36-48 hours of career and technology courses in the student's technical field may be accepted in block. In addition students may transfer from community and junior colleges up to 30 hours of academic courses. The students must complete a concentration and also complete the university core curriculum requirements.

Upon successful completion of the requirements for the Bachelor of Applied Arts and Sciences degree, the student's diploma and transcript indicate the Bachelor of Applied Arts and Sciences degree with a major in Applied Arts and Sciences was conferred.

A minimum of 42 hours must be completed at the advanced (300 and 400) level. A total of 120 total hours must be completed to earn this degree.

The staff members in the Academic Student Services Office at the UC assist all students in determining which program of study to pursue. This includes providing information about the variety of programs available, reviewing transcripts to aid in identifying any courses to be completed before entering the program of choice, and serving as liaison between the student and university program representatives. Students who have already earned an associate's degree or have a substantial number of college academic credit hours should contact the Academic Student Services Office for advising and to begin the transfer admission process for the university offering the degree program they desire to pursue.

Students desiring to major in a technical specialty area for the Bachelor of Applied Arts and Sciences must:

1. Present evidence of the development of an area of technical specialty with an Associate of Applied Sciences degree from a community/junior college.

A. Sixty-six semester hours (plus four semester hours of physical education activity) may be transferred from another educational institution. This should include thirty-six to forty-eight hours in-block course work in an organized technical program.

2. Complete a baccalaureate degree plan from residence and transfer credit which contains a minimum of 120 semester credit hours and includes the following:

A. 42 semester hours of advanced level courses.

B. A 21 hour minor in a field related to the student's technical specialty. All hours must be at the advanced level.

C. Complete "Core Curriculum" in general education.

D. 21 hours of advanced level electives or 12 hours of advanced electives and 9 hours of CAT 406.
