Commitment is well-tested by the demanding curriculum and an in-depth work practicum totaling 800 hours. To earn a baccalaureate degree, all University of Houston undergraduates must successfully complete the UH Core Curriculum, 42 semester credit hours of a general education program designed to create a balance between liberal arts education and professional specialization. A minimum total semester hours needed to graduate is 123. A maximum total of 66 hours may be transferred from a community college. Students may be eligible for an Associates degree from Lone Star College System after their first two years of study. Graduates find entry-level positions as front desk supervisors, catering sales managers, restaurant managers, club managers, food and beverage cost controllers, management trainees, and consultants. Graduates are quickly promoted to general managers, hospital foodservices managers, retirement community managers, and countless other management positions.

The staff members in the Academic Student Services Office at the UC assist all students in determining which program of study to pursue. This includes providing information about the variety of programs available, reviewing transcripts to aid in identifying any courses to be completed before entering the program of choice, and serving as liaison between the student and university program representatives. Students who have already earned an associate's degree or have a substantial number of college academic credit hours should contact the Academic Student Services Office for advising and to begin the transfer admission process for the university offering the degree program they desire to pursue.
