

# Nursing

The purpose of the baccalaureate nursing program is to prepare students for beginning professional practice as nurse generalists. Graduates are educated to meet community and state needs for nurses who can assume leadership roles in the delivery of health care. As nurse generalists, graduates are prepared to assume beginning positions in any area of nursing practice and have the academic foundation for advanced study in nursing.

The baccalaureate program is accredited by the Board of Nurse Examiners for the state of Texas, the National League for Nursing (NLN) and the Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education. Completion of the program leads to a Bachelor of Science degree with a major in nursing. Graduates of the college are eligible to take the National Council Licensure Examination to meet requirements for licensure to practice nursing.

The BSN program is designed to meet not only the needs of generic students who are beginning their education in nursing, but also to provide an opportunity for diploma or associate degree registered nurses (RNs) to pursue a Bachelor of Science degree in Nursing. Registered nurses who seek admission to the BSN program must meet the same prerequisite and degree requirements as generic students.

Nursing students pursue professional courses based on knowledge of physical, biological and social sciences, the humanities, and communication skills. Upon successful completion of requisite courses in these discipline as well as the university's core curriculum requirements, students are eligible for admission to the upper-division clinical studies unit of the College of Nursing. Students wanting to enter the RN – BSN transition program are admitted only in the Fall semester. The application deadline is March 1st. The minimum total credit hours required for the degree is 131.

The staff members in the Academic Student Services Office at the UC assist all students in determining which program of study to pursue. This includes providing information about the variety of programs available, reviewing transcripts to aid in identifying any courses to be completed before entering the program of choice, and serving as liaison between the student and university program representatives. Students who have already earned an associate's degree or have a substantial number of college academic credit hours should contact the Academic Student Services Office for advising and to begin the transfer admission process for the university offering the degree program they desire to pursue.

### All registered nurses seeking admission to the BSN program must submit the following credentials:

1. Completion of all pre-clinical course requirements with a minimum grade of "C" and a cumulative GPA of 2.50.
2. Students must present validation of an associate degree in nursing from a Texas nursing associate degree program or an NLN out-of-state accredited nursing program.
3. Documentation of a current license to practice nursing in the State of Texas.
4. Documentation of recent nursing practice of at least 6 months full-time or 1 year part-time or a refresher course with a clinical component within the last 2 years.

Deadlines are March 1st for Fall and October 1st for spring.

Thirty-five (35) semester hours will be awarded toward the BSN degree for nurses who have submitted the above credentials and who have completed the first 12 credit hours in the RN to BSN program.
