Steps to PREPARE for Basic Track Nursing Program Application

Step	Finished	Please read each step carefully.
1.	<input type="checkbox"/>	Enroll in Lone Star College System. If you have not taken classes at a LSCS campus within the last year, you must apply to the college, or update your application at www.lonestar.edu/admissions . If you need assistance with the application process please visit Admissions in Building C.
2.	<input type="checkbox"/>	Evidence of math proficiency is required <i>PRIOR</i> to application to the program. A student must have <u>either</u> : completed MATH 0310 (or an approved higher-level math class) with a minimum grade of "C" OR tested out of (above the level of) MATH 0310 on an approved placement test. If you need assistance, please visit Admissions in Building C.
3.	<input type="checkbox"/>	Submit official copies of all college transcripts to the Admissions Office at Lone Star College-Montgomery for the purpose of evaluation. Transcript evaluation can take 2-3 weeks. If you have previously submitted transcripts to a Lone Star College campus, please verify on myLoneStar, or with an advisor that your transcripts have been evaluated. Applicants who have attended high school and/or college in another country must have their transcripts evaluated and converted to U.S. credits by an approved outside agency. See www.naces.org/members.htm .
4.	<input type="checkbox"/>	Complete with a "C" or higher, ALL of the following REQUIRED pre-requisite classes: a. BIOL 2401 (Anatomy & Physiology I) – Must be completed within five (5) years b. ENGL 1301 (Composition & Rhetoric I)
5.	<input type="checkbox"/>	If any of the required BIOL courses are beyond the 5 year limit, you must successfully complete ONE of the following: • Retake the course with a minimum grade of C • Take BIOL 2404 with a minimum grade of C to refresh both BIOL 2401 & BIOL 2402 • Take a Continuing Education refresher course for the course that is out of date
6.	<input type="checkbox"/>	Additional courses which MAY BE TAKEN in advance, but are NOT REQUIRED for the application and that will apply to the RN Basic Track Nursing Degree Plan: a. BIOL 2402 Anatomy & Physiology II – (Must be less than 5 years old at the time of the application deadline). b. BIOL 2420 Medical Microbiology – (Must be less than 5 years old at the time of the application deadline). c. PSYC 2301 General Psychology d. ELECTIVE Humanities/Fine Arts – (Must be taken from approved list). e. RNSG 1301 Pharmacology – (Must be less than 5 years old at time of application deadline). It is recommended that students complete RNSG 1301 during the spring semester or summer semester prior to the start of the RN program, in order to not conflict with other RNSG classes once in the program.
7.	<input type="checkbox"/>	A cumulative GPA in high school and/or college of at least 2.0 is required. If a student has completed more than 24 semester hours of college courses, only the college GPA will be considered. Lone Star College System requires a minimum 2.0 GPA to be eligible to apply.
8.	<input type="checkbox"/>	Complete the HESI exam AT LEAST ONE WEEK PRIOR to the application deadline. In order to take the HESI exam, print the TESTING TICKET from the Prospective Nursing Student section of the webpage http://www.lonestar.edu/nursing-dept-montgomery.htm or pick one up in office B-120. Follow the directions on the testing ticket. • PLEASE NOTE: The HESI exam includes the following sections, and all sections of this exam must be taken at the same time: 1. Reading Comprehension 2. Grammar 3. Vocabulary/General Knowledge of the English Language 4. Math 5. Anatomy and Physiology 6. Critical Thinking • Applicant MUST have a minimum score of 80 on EACH of the first 5 sections of the HESI exam listed above in order to apply. • Applicants must score a minimum score of 750 on the Critical Thinking section in order to be eligible to apply. • HESI exam may be taken every 60 days. However , only the most <i>recent</i> exam scores will be used on the application.
9.	<input type="checkbox"/>	Proof of immunity to hepatitis B in the form of a quantitative titer. Titers are drawn 6 weeks after completing the hepatitis B vaccine series, which takes SIX MONTHS TO COMPLETE.
10.	<input type="checkbox"/>	Applicants who have a positive criminal history should be aware acceptance into the nursing program must be cleared through the Texas Board of Nursing (TBON). As part of this process, students may be requested to submit a declaratory order by the TBON. If you have a positive criminal history, please email the director at Mischelle.A.Hopper@lonestar.edu for instruction on how to begin this process. You will not need to give details on your infraction to the director.
